Who?

Parkhurst Residents and Business Owners Association (PRABOA) is dedicated to maintaining and enhancing the Parkhurst suburb for all its stakeholders, encompassing residents and businesses alike. Our funding is derived solely from membership fees, donations, and proceeds from special projects.

As a volunteer-driven organisation, we function as the fourth tier of government, bridging the gap between Parkhurst's ratepayers, residents, businesses, and the authorities of the City of Johannesburg.

In August 2024, Pauline Borton was engaged in support capacity; to manage communication and admin related to PRABOA's fundraising operations, community engagement and project manage the environment portfolio (which oversees a large portion of the neighbourhoods' public spaces). Service level agreements such as this are part of a longer-term strategy that recognises that Residents Associations/ Ratepayers Associations can no longer rely only on volunteers and good will. The challenges we face are exponentially growing and require fulltime oversight.

The PRABOA committee plays a central role in this oversight and management, taking collective responsibility for actions and decisions made. A role not for the faint hearted in complex and challenging times.

What?

A revised communication strategy that focused on connections and visual storytelling, gathered responses and interactions that surpassed those of 2024.

2025 saw the first full year of our newly launched communications campaign in line with our CI and website. This enabled us to effectively communicate and document all our key projects through dedicated communication channels. In addition, we were able to work strategically with local businesses, residents, volunteers and estate agents to breathe life into community led activities geared towards social cohesion, soft social activism and the overarching wellbeing of our village.

The activation of special projects has revealed potential collaborations and projects for 2026 – so a community programme has emerged in advance of the new year, as opposed to during the year (as it did in 2025).

Why?

A connected multidisciplinary community with a shared vision, is a stronger vehicle for change than a single entity.

2025 gave us the opportunity to network and encourage connections between innovative members of the community, calling on public participation through collective means, as opposed to stand alone and disparate projects.

This means our projects organically and incrementally grow and expand but are contained and managed within our own parameters and resources. This allows for individual investment as well communal expression. As our visibility and reach increases within our relatively small neighbourhood, our collective sense of social responsibility and wellbeing will grow.

This goes a long way to making the projects integrated into a bigger vision, and more resilient over time.

How?

Vital to PRABOA’s continued mechanisms of community support and communication is the development revenue models for PRABOA to sustain it into the future. The income



generating models are designed with community in mind and encourage collective contributions with measurable ROI and value add for subscribers.

In 2025 we began piloting various income generating plans.

Some of these initiatives include:

1. PRABOA Membership (pensioners, residents and business subscription)
2. The ongoing SafeParks Public Safety and Security initiative (including the services of 24/7 and Vuma Cam)
3. Estate Agents initiative/ co -marketing opportunities
4. Business Listings / co -marketing opportunities for business subscribers.
5. 5th Avenue Park Care group
6. QR codes directing donors to Zapper to make contributions to upgrades and maintenance
7. The reigniting of the Parkhurst Village Fair, as well as the continued activation of firm favourites like World Clean Up Day and Parkhurst’s Trick or Treat.
8. Communication: management of social media, volunteers and community engagement programmes.

It is clear, that PRABOA can no longer rely solely on donations and in-kind support, we need to continue to create community centric mechanisms that produce revenue and value to our neighbourhood simultaneously. All individual agendas are valued, and it is our job to connect the dots between a stand-alone project and the benefit to the community in the long term.

The reality is that PRABOA needs more financial support to further empower dedicated service providers to drive these campaigns and strategies, so that they can fill the gap between the volunteer committee member and community engagement, ensuring consistency, while holding all projects in alignment with our roles and responsibilities.

The bottom line is that we need consistent financial support that will enable us to plan and distribute funds effectively.

Village Fair does it with flair

After nearly a decade-long break, the Parkhurst Village Fair made a vibrant comeback at Verily Park on September 27, transforming the neighbourhood into a lively hub of laughter, music, and local flavour.

Hosted by the Parkhurst Residents and Business Owners Association (Praboa), the event brought together neighbours, entrepreneurs, and performers, all united in the spirit of community.

The fair provided a day full of entertainment, from sunrise yoga to live bands and delicious street food. Local businesses, including favourites like Yaya's Rusks and the Grow Parkhurst community garden, ensured there was something for everyone to enjoy.

One of the fair's highlights was a young entrepreneur, Scott Sole, for instance, set up a lemonade stand with his cupcake-expert friend. "I had a lot of lemons on my lemon tree, and since it was winter, I wasn't sure what to do with them," Scott explained. "We thought the fair would be a fun way to work together and maybe make a bit of money." Their stand was just one example of the creativity that filled the park.

Pauline Borton from Praboa described the day as a resounding success. "This was our first fair in over eight years, and the community's response was phenomenal. The support,

collaboration, and energy we experienced truly made the event special. It was designed and curated by the community, and none of it would have been possible without our volunteers, local businesses, and generous sponsors."

The fair's programme was as diverse as the community itself. Visitors explored a wide range of stalls offering food, crafts, fashion, beauty products, and handmade goods. There were interactive competitions, pop-up photo booths, and zones dedicated to children and pets. Entertainment included live music, dance performances, yoga sessions, a quirky dog competition, and other activities that kept visitors engaged throughout the day. Meanwhile, adults enjoyed the adult zone, where they could relax with drinks and watch the rugby, adding a festive, communal atmosphere to the event.

Youth volunteers also played a vital role in the event. Ruth Quinn, an online student with a passion for art and drama, described her experience as both enjoyable and educational. "Volunteering has given me the chance to develop practical skills, from writing emails to coordinating events, all while

helping my community. I'm excited about our mural project for the library walk, which will feature a tree representing every one who contributed."

Children enjoyed the kiddies zone with face painting, jumping castles, and water slides, while laughter filled the air. By the end of the Parkhurst Village Fair, it was clear that community matters. The event celebrated food, music, and fun, showcasing the joy that comes from neighbours coming together.

ADOPT A PET: WOODY AND FRIENDS NEED A HOME

Woodrock Animal Rescue has set up a Pup Pop-Up centre at The Garden Shop in Parktown North. Locals are invited to visit the shop between 09:00 and 14:00 every Saturday and Sunday to view their selection of adorable dogs. If you would like to adopt an animal, you will be required to fill out a screening questionnaire and have a home visit before the dog can be taken home. The cost of the adoption is R1 850 for a puppy, and R1 650 for an adult dog, which includes vaccinations, de-worming, flea treatment, microchipping, and sterilisation. Should the puppy not be ready for sterilisation at the time of going home, Woodrock will provide a sterilisation certificate to be claimed by one of our affiliated vets. Proof of sterilisation must be sent to Woodrock. If you adopt a second adult dog you will receive a 25% discount on the total fee. 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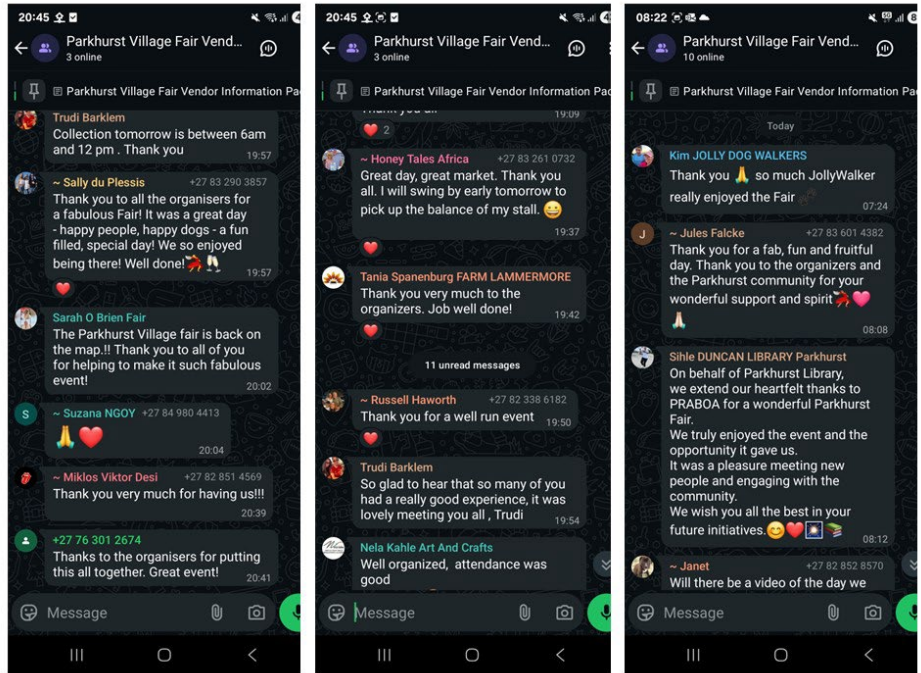

Roles and Responsibilities:

Role and Responsibilities of PRABOA



- **Advocacy and Representation**
 - PRABOA represents the interests of residents by collaborating closely with the Ward 117 Councillor and participating in Ward Committees.
 - The association works with the City of Johannesburg Region B Director offices to ensure effective service delivery and adherence to municipal by-laws, addressing issues such as illegal signage and unauthorized street vendors.
- **Safety and Security Initiatives (SafeParks)**
 - PRABOA oversees a proactive community policing policy known as SafeParks, in partnership with a preferred security service provider, 24/7 Security.
 - SafeParks collaborates with Vumacam and 24/7 Security's Smart Surveillance Control Room for comprehensive CCTV monitoring, including Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR) for real-time alerts on vehicles of interest.
 - Through a service level agreement, 24/7 Security provides continuous street patrols and prompt responses to alarms, panic signals, and electric fence activations.
 - The initiative maintains strong ties with the South African Police Services (Parkview District), the Community Policing Forum, and other stakeholders like JMPD to effectively combat crime at the community level.
- **Community Development and Maintenance**
 - PRABOA supports and maintains green spaces within Parkhurst and has officially adopted Verity Park.
 - The association actively monitors and reports infrastructure issues such as potholes, burst water pipes, faulty water meters, and non-functional streetlights to the relevant municipal departments for timely resolution.

Parkhurst's architectural heritage is a cornerstone of our community. With structures dating back to the early 20th century, we strive to preserve and protect our architectural legacy. All building plans must adhere to PRABOA's guidelines and undergo thorough review before submission to the authorities.

It's important to note that structures older than 60 years in age fall under the protective umbrella of the National Heritage Resources (NHR) Act 25 of 1999, irrespective of their perceived historical significance.

Owners intending to build must submit any intended plans for alterations/ changes, including all as-built structures that have not yet been approved. Find out more about the process here: <https://parkhurstvillage.com/building-planning/>
